- 3. That in the judgment of the said United States Attorney, the testimony and other information from the said Ada P. Johnson is necessary to the public interest; and
- 4. The aforementioned motion filed herein has been made with the approval of Kenneth A. Blanco, Deputy Assistant Attorney General, Criminal Division, United States Department of Justice, pursuant to the authority vested in her by 18 U.S.C. § 6003(b) and 28 C.F.R. § 0.175(a).

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §§ 6002-6003 that Ada P. Johnson give testimony and provide other information which she refused to give on the basis of her privilege against self-incrimination as to all matters about which she may be interrogated before the Court within the scope of the current trial.

PROVIDED THAT, testimony given pursuant to this immunity or evidence derived therefrom shall not be used against the witness in any criminal proceeding, except in a prosecution for perjury, giving a false statement or otherwise failing to comply with this Order.
