CLERK'S MINUTES
PRETRIAL CONFERENCE

REMARKS: Defendants Elder and Johnson appear in person with counsel; defendant Solomon appears telephonically with counsel. Judy Waterson, Diversion Investigator with the DEA, also present at counsel table. Pretrial conference held as this case is set for trial on June 21, 2010.

Discussion held regarding the parties' witness and exhibit lists. No additional objections by parties to any witness or exhibit that was not covered in the Daubert hearing or in any motion in limine. Counsel for Elder makes a request for copies of defendant Rostie's tax returns. Government stated those documents were provided to him via email the previous evening.

Discussion held regarding outstanding motions; particularly Doc. 50, Doc 102, Doc 105, Doc 107, Doc. 169, Doc. 235, Doc. 238, Doc. 237 and Doc. 236.

Regarding the length of trial, including jury selection, the Government's case will take six days, defendant Elder's case will take two days; defendant Johnson's case will take two days; defendant Solomon's case will take two days. Defendants Solomon, Elder, and Johnson may take the stand. This case is definitely for trial. The Court directs the parties to file voir dire and jury instructions by Monday, June 14, 2010.

Government is directed to file its motion in limine regarding the Texas Medical Center letter by Thursday, June 10. Defense is given until Monday, June 14 to respond.
