ORDER GRANTING DEFENDANT'S MOTION TO MARRY WHILE IN CUSTODY

On April 27, 2011, defendant filed a motion requesting permission to be allowed to marry Rachel Watt while detained in the custody of the United States Marshal pending trial.

An incarcerated individual's constitutional right to marry is subject to any restrictions which are reasonably related to legitimate government interests. <u>Turner v. Safley</u>, 482 U.S. 78 (1987); <u>Pargo v. Elliott</u>, 49 F.3d 1355, 1356 (8th Cir. 1995). The government has not suggested that any significant interest will be affected by the granting of defendant's motion and has indicated it is not opposed to defendant's request. Therefore, it is

ORDERED that defendant's motion is granted so long as the United States Marshal Service does not incur any additional monetary expense.
